Academic Requirements

RVRC courses map to four of the six NUS General Education pillars:


- Communities and Engagement (RVN)
- Critique and Expression (RVX)
- Cultures and Connections (RVC)
- Singapore Studies (RVSS)

Students read one course from each of the four pillars to fulfil RVRC's programme requirements. Each course carries four units and programme completion is recognised on students' official NUS transcript.



The College Student Committee (CSC) is RVRC's elected student leadership that aims to bring the entire college community together.


CSC organises and oversees college-wide events throughout the academic year.

Pursuing Interests

Interest Groups (IGs) are student-initiated and student-led groups that encompass a diverse range of interests, such as sports, arts, and clubs and societies.

With over 35 IGs in RVRC, students can explore new interests, pursue their passions, and connect with like-minded members in the College community. Participating in one or more IGs is common among RVRC residents.



RVRC residents are organised into seven smaller communities called Houses. Each house is supported by a Resident Fellow, Resident Assistants, and an elected House Committee.

Houses are named after rare or threatened animals indigenous to Singapore in line with the **College's theme of sustainability**.

Residents form another layer of **social support network** with other residents across different years of study and faculty backgrounds.

RVRC is situated strategically at the heart of the university's Kent Ridge campus. With close proximity to most faculties, residents have quick access to their classes, as well as key student life amenities, including the University Sports Centre and University Health Centre.
